Maria and I, Anne, left Denmark on the 23rd of February to go to Romania. Our first stop would be in Berlin where Ann and I have some missionary-friends, Irene and Paul Neustupny. Every time we go to Romania we stop by to say hello. Nice way to keep a friendship - and a blessing being together to talk, pray and fellowship.

We were well prepared for Central-Europe winter, chains and a snow shovel and warm clothes, big boots and an attitude that was going to conquer any problem.

But we only had very little snow on the way. We drove from Berlin to Bors, to Misu and Marians Mot's home, in one day. It was a looong drive, but kind of nice - seems they are not so far away then!!



We were to stay with the Mot-family and the boys had vacated their room for us to have. Nice of

them. All in all it was a good surprise to arrive at the house!! More building has been done to the actual house and inside you can picture the idea of how it is going to be once the roof is put on. Hopefully this summer as they have serious problems with dampness. Serious problems! But downstairs in the basement where they live all the rooms have been nicely decorated. It was a pleasant surprise!



And the whole sense of family and good spirit was nice to experience. We enjoyed all of them, listening to Manu and Mishi now earning money and driving dirt-bikes - and seeing them after a race was something! They were very proud of their muddy clothes and faces. One day in Oradea I had a nice time with Alex - we talked about everything such as life and Jesus, relationships and disappointments... And he did a good job translating for us. Georgiana did some translating too, and she managed quite well too. Naomi was present but very quiet, and Doro has matured a lot and is growing into a sweet, smart girl. Demi was his old nice self - voice a little hoarse and a good grin on his face.



The three youngest children have started in a Christian school which they all enjoy very much. Mariana is enjoying her job as a nurse. Money is always needed, and I am pleased they have some now to finish the house and to have the kids in another school.

Misu is still teaching at the school in Lazareni, and he's pastoring the church. By the way he was so pleased with the new teacher-team at the school; they have - he says - such a good relationship. They can pray together and have real fellowship in the Lord.



Once a week Misu and Mariana have a small group of people coming to their house, Romanians mostly. Some have been born again recently, others have been Christians for years, and they also enjoy the fellowship and some freshness and new songs. We went to see a bar-owner, Bujo, as he really wanted to hear about Jesus. Nice job! Easy to tell the gospel to someone who's eager to listen. And before we left, Misu and I prayed with Bujo. Now, I don't think he got born again that night, but I am very sure he will. And I'm looking forward to seeing the results of his conversion! He's in touch with so many people! Great.



Almost as soon as we got to Bors, I went to say hello to people in Lazareni. I knew I wanted to see Mariana and her new baby. Last time Ann and I were there, she was in Ger-



many picking strawberries. It was a very nice visit. I had Sebastian with me as a translator (he has a very good understanding of English - and Romanian, and he is eager and very nice to work with!). Nice also to say hello to the teachers and the kids.

During the weekend we had Danish visitors from Onesti. I invited them to come. I really wanted them to come to see and taste the flavor of the

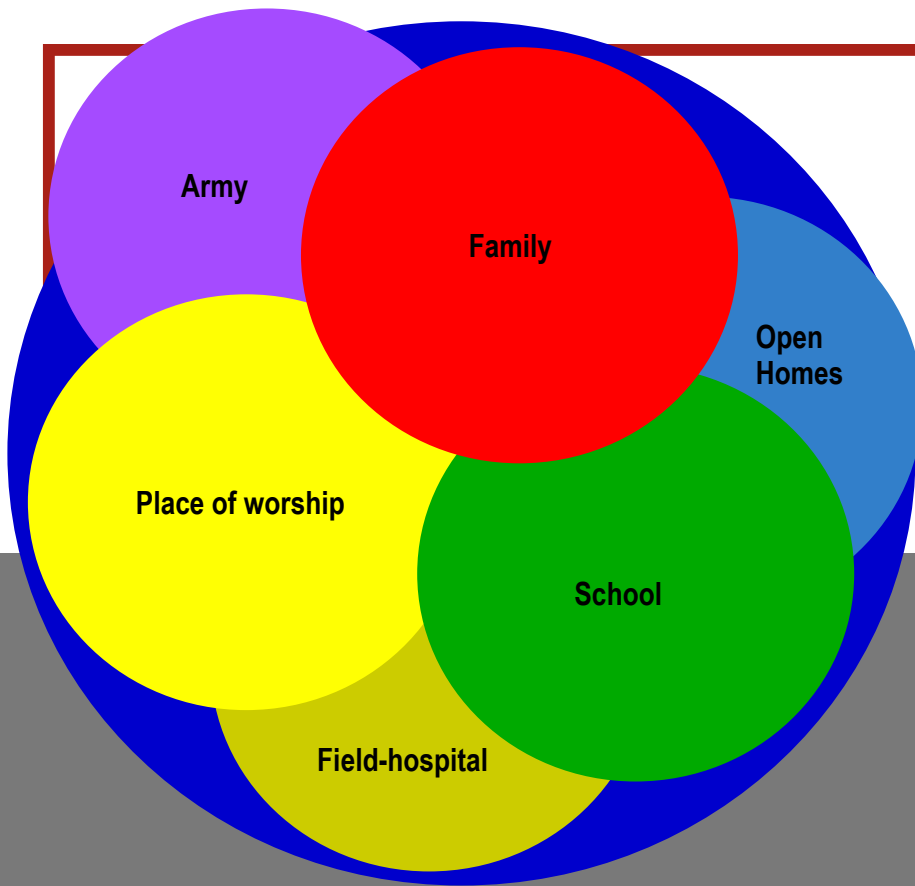
